

RML (Report Markup Language) is ReportLab's own language for specifying the appearance of a printed page, which is converted into PDF by the utility rml2pdf.

These RML samples showcase techniques and features for generating various types of output and are distributed within our commercial package as test cases. Each should be self explanatory and stand alone.

Flowing text (heading)

This is flowing text inside a frame, which is set in the page template. The template lays out the static parts of the page, such as the logo and footer image, and defines a location and size for the flowing content frame. The frame border is visible because of the attribute showBoundary="1" on the template tag.

I have now started a new paragraph with a new <para> tag; note that because there was no spaceAfter attribute on the previous paragraph, there is no gap between these blocks of text. I have also assigned a new paragraph style which is no longer in italics. **Here is some red text enclosed by tags, which can set special styles within a paragraph.** Donec metus velit, varius et facilisis non, facilisis a metus. Aliquam erat volutpat. Maecenas hendrerit mollis diam a volutpat. Class aptent taciti sociosqu ad litora torquent per conubia nostra, per inceptos himenaeos. This paragraph has a new para style assigned whose font size is larger and whose spaceAfter and spaceBefore attributes are 12pts. There should be 12 points before and after this paragraph.
