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

Hong Kong Destination Guide

Destination Information



The Hong Kong Special Administrative Region of the People's Republic of China is located at the south coast of China. Hong Kong usually participates in international events under the name "Hong Kong, China". The city consists of Hong Kong Island, Kowloon, and the New Territories. The Kowloon Peninsula is attached to the New Territories in the north, and the New Territories are in turn connected to Mainland China across the Shenzhen River.

Attractions

Hong Kong Disneyland

Hong Kong Disneyland offers classic Disney attractions and original creations in four themed lands: Main Street USA, Adventureland, Tomorrowland and Fantasyland.

Ocean Park

Ocean Park is Asia's premier sea-life and animal theme park. Built as an oceanarium in 1977, it boasts the finest aquarium in Asia, with an excellent collection of sharks and fish. The park's Ocean Theatre has daily performances featuring dolphins and sea lions. The park is also home to giant pandas bestowed to Hong Kong by the Chinese government. In addition to 18 mechanical rides, marine mammals exhibits and performances, Ocean Park presents five outstanding festive events every year.

The Peak

Looking down from The Peak you'll be amazed by the spectacular view of the surrounding city skyline, the world-famous Victoria Harbour and Kowloon, towering skyscrapers and peaceful green hillsides.

Ladies' Market

One of the most popular street markets in Hong Kong, Ladies' Market is a must-visit destination for fashion lovers with an eye for bargain-priced clothing, bags, accessories, toys, cosmetics and household knick-knacks. The stalls making up this enjoyable market can be found on Tung Choi Street, Mong Kok. It is open from noon until 11:30pm.

Avenue of Stars

The Avenue of Stars features commemorative plaques, handprints of movie celebrities, descriptive milestones, kiosk with movie memorabilia, a towering Hong Kong Film Awards statuette, and a life-size statue of the legendary kung-fu action star, Bruce Lee. It is also a good place to watch the spectacular A Symphony of Lights, a nightly multimedia show with added pyrotechnics on special occasions.

Weather

Hong Kong is an all-year-round destination. It enjoys a mild climate from the middle of September to the end of February, while the weather from May to mid-September is rather warm and humid. Eighty per cent of Hong Kong's precipitation occurs between May and September, with August registering the highest rainfall.

Currency

Legal tender is the Hong Kong dollar (HK\$). Coins, issued by the government, are bronze-colored for 10 cents, 20 cents and 50 cents; silver-colored for HK\$1, HK\$2, and HK\$5; nickel and bronze for HK\$10. Automated teller machines (ATMs) can be found almost everywhere and some HSBC "Electronic Money" machines provide 24-hour cash withdrawal (HK\$) service for Visa and MasterCard holders. American Express cardholders have access to Jetco ATMs and can withdraw local currency and travelers' cheques at the Express Cash ATMs in town.

Language

Cantonese (a dialect of Chinese) and English are official languages in Hong Kong. Most of the taxi drivers understand English, yet, it is suggested to ask the Hotel's Concierge to write down the destination in Chinese characters.

Travelling Tips

Departing and transit visitors should note that enhanced security measures are now in effect at Hong Kong International Airport. Visitors are reminded not to carry any sharp objects with a point or blade such as knives, cutters, scissors, razor blades, or household cutlery in carry-on luggage. Pack them in your check-in baggage. From 21 March 2007, restrictions will also apply to carry-on liquids, gels and aerosols, which must be in containers no bigger than 100ml and placed in a single (maximum one per passenger) transparent sealable bag with a capacity not exceeding one litre. Electrical Voltage

The standard electrical voltage in HK is 220 volts AC, 50HZ, so an adaptor is needed for any 100-volt appliances and electrical equipment. The majority of electrical outlets in Hong Kong take a three-pronged plug. An adaptor can be easily purchased in Hong Kong.

Dining Tips

Although forks and knives can be easily found in many restaurants, chopsticks are always popular utensils in most Asian cuisine restaurants in Hong Kong.

How to use chopsticks?







Step One



Use the tips of the thumb, index and middle fingers to hold the other stick like a pen. Make sure the tips of the two sticks line up.

Step Two




Use the tips of the thumb, index and middle fingers to hold the other stick like a pen. Make sure the tips of the two sticks line up.

Step Three



Pivot the upper stick up and down towards the stationary lower stick. With this motion one can pick up food of surprising size.

Step Four



With enough practice, the two sticks function like a pair of pinchers.

Visa

Visitors from most countries can enter Hong Kong without a visa for periods of 7 days to 6 months, depending on nationality. Check with any Chinese embassy or consulate for the latest status.

Entry regulation

Nationals of most countries are not required to obtain visas and can stay for periods varying from seven days to 180 days, depending on nationality.
